<p>News Report</p> <p><u>Council Employee Dies From Wounds</u></p> <p>Intimation has been received from the War Office that Pte. Samuel C. Ashley, R.A.M.C., died from wounds received in action on May 25. He was 35 years of age, and joined the colours in October, 1914, and had been in France since May, 1915. Born in Liscard, he was educated at St. Mary's School, and was in the employ of the Corporation. He was the eldest son of Mr. W. Ashley, and of the late Mrs. Annie Ashley, and resided with his sister Mrs. Parker, 20 Ashville Road, Seacombe.</p>
