News Report

Died Of Wounds

The sad information has been received that Private Albert Victor Bell, died from wounds at a Casualty Clearing Station, in France, on October 15<sup>th</sup>. He joined up in September 1916 with the Cheshire Regiment, and was transferred to the Machine Gun Corps, being drafted to France at the end of February, 1917. He was educated at the High Grade School, Parkhill Road, Liverpool, and was formerly employed at the Uveco Works, Poulton. He was 21 years of age, and attended St. Luke's Church, and was the youngest son of Mrs Mary Bell, and the late Mr William Bell, 22, Mostyn Street, Poulton. By some mistake Pte. Bell was officially reported last November as having died from wounds, and had been home since on leave.

An "In Memoriam" service will be held tomorrow (Sunday) evening, at St. Luke's Church, Poulton.
