News Report

Brothers At Uveco Mills

(April 1918)

The sad intelligence has been received of the death from wounds on April 3, at the Military Hospital, Rouen, of Pte. [John Bennett](#), Cheshire Regt. Twenty-seven years of age, he was educated at Wallasey old school, and previous to joining up in August, 1915, he was employed with the Uveco Cereals Ltd., Birkenhead Road, Seacombe. He had been in France eighteen months. He attended St. Luke's Church, and was the third son of Mrs. Mary Bennett, and of the late Mr. Samuel Bennett, 7 Cedar Grove, Poulton. He leaves a widow and one child to mourn his loss.

Private Edward Bennett, Cheshire Regt., aged 25 years, has been reported as missing since July 31, 1917. He enlisted in August, 1915, and had been six months in France. He was educated at Poulton Council School, and was in the employ of the Uveco Cereals, Ltd. Any news concerning him will be gratefully received by his mother, 7, Cedar Grove, Liscard.

A Third Sacrifice

(June 1918)

In our issue of April we asked for information concerning Pte. Edward Bennett, Cheshire Regt. (Lewis Gun Section) who was posted as missing since July 31, 1917. He is the third son of Mrs. Bennett, 7, Cedar Grove, Poulton. She has received official notification that he was killed in action on that date. Only 25 years of age, he joined the Army in August, 1915 and was educated at Poulton Council School, and formerly employed at the Uveco Cereals, Ltd. Two other sons died from wounds received in action.
