News Report	<p><u>Seacombe Mill Employee Killed</u></p> <p>Information has been received of the death in action of Private Norman Stanley Bower, King's Liverpool Regt., between Sept. 27-29. He joined the Army on October 4, 1917, and was drafted to France late Easter Monday. He was educated at Riverside Council School, and formerly employed at Buchanan's Flour Mills, Ltd. He was the second son of the late Mr and Mrs Frederick Bower, of Seacombe, and resided with his sisters at 37, Demesne Street. His elder brother Sergt. Fred Bower, is in France, and has been awarded the Military Medal.</p>
