<p>News Report</p> <p><u>At The Dardanelles</u></p> <p>Official intimation of the death of her husband from wounds has been received by Mrs. J. Boyland, of 34, Serpentine Road, Liscard. He was an old R.N.R., and been with the White Star Line for a number of years. Three months ago he rejoined the Naval Reserve and was attached to the Aerial Section, which is doing service at the Dardanelles. Some time ago he was wounded and was taken to one of the hospitals at Gibraltar where he subsequently expired. Other than these facts, little information has been received by his wife. He was 58 years of age, and one of his sons is a member of the Army Flying Corps. Some time ago the deceased was awarded a medal by the Royal Humane Society for bravery at sea in life-saving.</p> <p>Son [<a href="#">C.D. Boyland</a>] died 03/03/1917</p>
