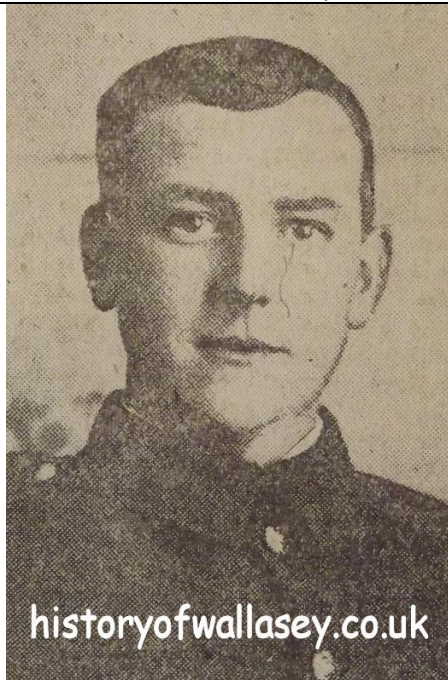

News Report

Poulton Soldier Dies from Wounds

An official telegram has been received that Pte. William Bradbury died from gunshot wounds in the right arm, right leg, and chest, at the Clearing Station, France, on the 17th inst. The brave soldier, who was in his 20th year, enlisted in the Cheshire Regt. On March 31st, and was transferred to the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers, and had only been two months in France. He was educated at Poulton Council School, and was a member of St. Luke's Church and Sunday School. A bright business career had been mapped out for him. He was a keen footballer. He was the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. James Bradbury, 45, Claughton Drive, Poulton.
