News Report

Died Of Wounds

Private Walter Frederick Bradley, who was severely wounded by gunshot in the head, right hand, cheek, and shoulder, on September 8th, died at the Military Hospital, Dover, on October 21st. He joined the South Wales Borderers in February last, and was transferred to the Royal Welsh Fusiliers on being drafted to France in June. He was only in his 19th year, and educated at Poulton Council School, and was apprenticed with Messrs. Irwin, Sons and Co., grocers, Borough Road, Seacombe. He was a son of Mr and Mrs Richard Bradley, 1 Rosalind Street, Poulton.

The interment took place on Monday, at Rake Lane Cemetery. The coffin draped with the Union Jack was conveyed on a gun carriage, accompanied by a detachment of the South Wales Borderers, in charge of Sergt. Barrett. A service was conducted at St. Luke's Church, by the vicar, the Rev. R.D. Hughes, M.A., B.D., who also performed the last rites at the graveside. Two volleys were fired,

and the "Last Post" was sounded.
