| <p>News Report</p> <p><u>Seacombe Actor Killed</u></p> <p>Intimation has been received that Lance-Corpl. Charles A.W. Brown was killed in action on December 12. He joined the East Surry Regt., at the outbreak of the war, and was transferred to the London Regt. He was drafted to France in October, 1917, and afterwards sent to Italy in November. Forty-one years of age, he finished his education at the Wallasey Grammar School, and was formerly employed with Messrs. Attwood, Beaver, and Co., Liverpool, and latterly took up the profession of an actor. He was the second son of Mrs. Rose Brown, and of the late Mr. W.S. Brown, 43 Brougham Road, Seacombe.</p> | |
