<u>Wallasey Major Dies Of Wounds</u>	
<p>Major Norman Q. Burnyeat, of the R.F.A., has died of wounds received in action on August 6. The young officer, who was only 23 years of age, had a brilliant career, having risen from a private to the rank of major by close application to his work. When the war broke out he was in Antwerp, and immediately enlisted in the R.F.A. He went to France as Captain early in the year, and while in command of a battery was promoted to major. He was educated at the Liverpool college, and was the son of Mr. John Burnyeat, of Messrs. Burnyeat and Dalzell, Liverpool, and Mrs. Burnyeat, of Garff, Dovedale Road, New Brighton.</p>
