Seacombe Soldier's Death

The sad news was received last week at the home of Private Richard Campbell, 6, Gladstone Road, Seacombe, that he had been killed on October 3rd, 1915. Previously he had been reported missing, but this message came to state that he was dead. He belonged to the 2nd Cheshire Regiment, and was in his twenty-seventh year. He joined the Army on March 13th, 1915.

The late Private Campbell was a Roman Catholic and member of Our Lady and St. Joseph's Church, Seacombe. He was employed at Messrs. Vernon's mills. After joining the Army he went to Chester, and then continued his training at Birkenhead. He went to France on July 14th, and had only been there three months when he was reported missing.

His brother, Thomas Campbell, is also serving with the colours as a private.
