#### News Report

##### Local Footballer Killed

The official sad news has been received that Corpl. George Alfred Carsberg, Cheshire Regt., was either killed in action or died from wounds on May 31<sup>st</sup>, but no definite particulars are to hand. He joined the colours in August, 1914, and was drafted to France in August, 1915. He was wounded in April last. Only 21 years of age, he was educated at St. Bede's School, Bradford, and at St. Francis Xavier's College, Liverpool. The gallant corporal was formerly a clerk in the claims department of Messrs. Elder, Dempster and Co., Ltd. HE was a good all-round sportsman, football being his chief hobby; he was also one of the promoters of the Dalmorton Road Rovers. He was the youngest son of Mr and Mrs William Henry Carsberg, "Craig Lea," Dalmorton Road, New Brighton.
