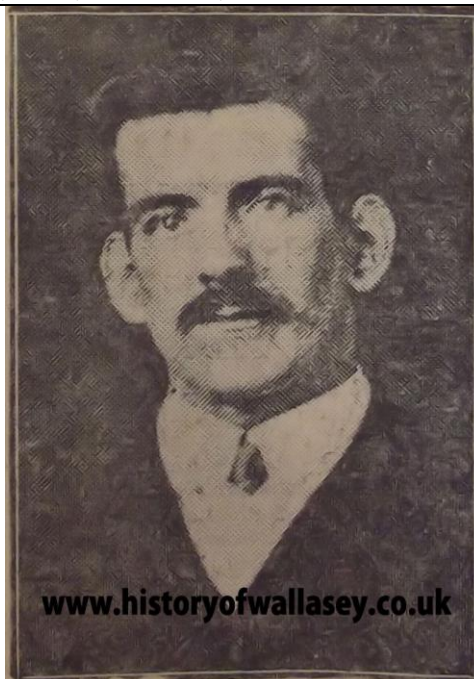

#### News Report

##### Guardsman's Death At Neuve Chapelle

Private George Carson, 1<sup>st</sup> Grenadier Guards, brother of Mrs. Deakin, 3 Adelaide Street, Poulton, was killed in action at Neuve Chapelle on March 12<sup>th</sup>. Born in Liscard, he was well-known in that district, having attended St. Mary's School.

At the outbreak of the war he was in Canada and as a reservist received a summons home, passing through England without seeing any of his friends or relatives, and was drafted to the front in September. Before going to Canada, he was employed on the London and North-Western Railway, Birkenhead. He leaves a young widow and two children. The youngest he has never seen, having been born while his father was in the trenches. Private Carson is the youngest of three sons of the late Robert and Elizabeth Carson, of Liscard, who are serving with the colours. Sergeant T. Carson who served with the Grenadier

Guards through the Boar War, is in the 14<sup>th</sup> Cheshire Regiment, and Private J. Carson is training in the 18<sup>th</sup> Cheshire Regiment.
