News Report

Shot Through The Heart

Corporal S.R. Carter, who had resided with his parents at 17, Withington Road, Seacombe, was shot through the heart after a successful attack on the German trenches. He stood for a moment whilst his men were entering their trenches, and was struck by a rifle shot, death being instantaneous. The deceased went through the memorable charge at Hooge, and too part in the fighting at Ypres, Loos and Hill 60. He joined the colours on the outbreak of war in August, 1914, and went abroad six months later. He attended the Vaughan Road Schools, New Brighton, and was a member of the Egremont Gymnasium. He has two brothers serving the country, the elder being first officer on an Indian troopship, and the younger brother, who went through the Sulva Bay

expedition, is now in Egypt.
