##### Seacombe Baker Killed

Another name has been added to the long list of Walalsey brave men who have paid the supreme sacrifice for their homes and country. Private Vincent Chesters, Yorkshire and Lancashire Regt., was killed in action on November 27. He joined the colours in October last year, and was shortly afterwards drafted to France, where he contracted trench fever. He went as a boy to Messrs. Lloyd Brothers, bakers, Wheatland Lane, and worked his way up to be manager. Much sympathy has been extended to his young wife, who resides at 31, Crosfield Road, and his parents at Northbrook Road, Seacombe.
