Accidentally Suffocated

We regret to record the death of Private William Clarke. He was gassed in July, 1917, and recovered, but died from accidental suffocation on December 20. Twenty years of age, he joined the colours two years ago, and had been twelve months in France. He is the second son of Mr and Mrs J. Clarke, of Liverpool, and his sister, Mrs T. Richards, resides at "Montclair," Princes Way, Wallasey.
