Clement, 62, Guildford Street, Egremont, that her husband, Sapper Albert Ernest Clement, of the Royal Engineers, attached to the Cheshires, was killed in action on November 4<sup>th</sup>. He was employed as general smith with Messrs. W. Peake and Co., burdle makers, Seel Street, Liverpool. He joined the army nine months ago, and had only been in France three weeks.
