Killed By A Shell

Signaller Leslie Coghlan, K.L.R., son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Coghlan, of Liscard, was killed by a shell on October 26th, aged twenty-one.. He joined at the early age of seventeen, and served eleven months with the K.L.R. in France. He was an old boy of St. Mary's School, Liscard, and before enlisting was in the employ of Messrs. H.M. Quiggin, solicitors, Harrington Street, Liverpool. Writing to his married sister, the deceased's captain says:-

"I regret to inform you that your brother was killed by a shell bursting outside his dug-out on the 26th October. Death was instantaneous. Kindly accept my most sincere sympathy, also the sympathy of his comrades. He was a lad of whom the officers and men had a good opinion, and who always carried out his duties in a cheerful manner. Kindly convey to his relatives my most sincere sympathy."
