News Report

"Hard To Replace"

Mr and Mrs Richard Connor, of 29, Merton Road, Liscard, have been officially informed that their son, Private T. Connor, of the Cheshire Regiment, was killed in action on July 4th whilst taking part in an attack on the enemy's trenches. Sergeant W. Higham, in writing to the parents says:- "Your son was a good soldier, and the Battalion through his loss and also many others of the company is deprived of such men as are hard to replace. The sympathy of all is with you in your sorrow, and our hope is that you will find consolation in knowing that he died nobly as one of England's sons, fighting for the friends he left behind." Prior to the war, Private Connor was employed at Mr Jones's brickworks, Wallasey Village.
