Liscard Rifleman's Fate

After serving in France for fourteen months and going through the Somme and several other battles, Rifleman John (Jack) Joseph Conway, K.L.R., has been unofficially reported as killed. The news reached his parents, Mr and Mrs Laurence Conway, 116 Seabank Road, Liscard, in a letter from the chaplain, who wrote to say that he had buried him according to the rites of the Catholic Church, which points to an instantaneous death. It is under these circumstances that his sorrowing parents have no recourse but to believe him killed in action on June 23rd.

Jack Conway was the youngest of four brothers serving, being only 21 years of age, and prior to enlistment was employed as a clerk in the Rodney Street branch of the London City and Midland Bank. His eldest brother is still serving in France, while another has been discharged crippled in the legs, which will probably be permanent.
