<p>Chronicle News</p> <p><u>Liscardian Does At Sea</u></p> <p>After being wounded at the Dardanelles about a fortnight ago, Thomas H. Corley, aged 23, belonging to the Mersey Division of the Royal Naval Volunteers' Reserve, is reported to have died whilst on the way to England, and to have been buried at sea.</p> <p>He was a son of Mr James P. Corley, chief clerk in the Liverpool Town Clerk's office, and had been in the service of the Corporation as a clerk in the Tramways Office, Hatton Garden.</p> <p>For several years Corley belonged to the Naval Volunteer Reserve, and took an enthusiastic interest in the work of the force. He participated in the Antwerp expedition, being amongst those who successfully evaded the German advance.</p> <p>A single man, he resided with his father at 171, Seaview Road, Liscard.</p>
