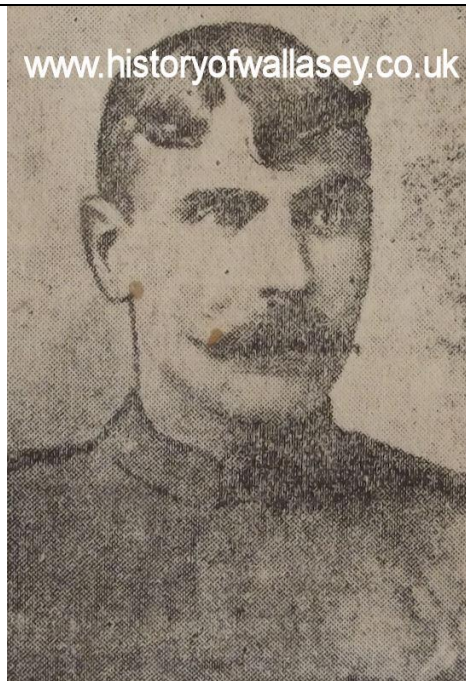

#### News Report

#### Died From Wounds

Gunner John Peter Cox, of the Siege Battery, R.G.A., has died from wounds received in action. The official report from the War Office says:- "Regret the only information in the hands of this department is that the late soldier died from wounds." He was 40 years of age and joined the Army at the age of 16, and being a Reserve man was called up at the commencement of the war, when he was sent to France. The brave soldier went through the South African War. He was the eldest son of Mrs. Mary Cox, who is 78, and of the late Mr. John Cox, of the Connaught Rangers. 129, Wheatland Lane, Seacombe. His wife resides at 5, Whitford Terrace, Egremont. Another son is serving in Salonika.
