News Report

An Only Son

Mr and Mrs Charles E. Dahman, 3, Buckingham Road, Wallasey, have been notified of the sad news that their only son, Lance-Corpl. Anthony Charles Dahman (Tony), Cheshire Regt., died from wounds at the French Military Hospital at Meaux, on June 1. He joined the colours on March 28, 1916, and was drafted to France the beginning of July in the same year. He volunteered for active service, for which he got his first stripe. He was in a big push at the Somme battle, where he was wounded in the leg, and invalided home. He went out again at the end of June, 1917, and was wounded a second time last February. He was 24 years of age, and was educated at St. Loysius College, Highgate, London, N., and previous to enlistment was studying photography with Mr. J.W. Mansell. Moorfields, Liverpool. He was a good all round sportsman.
