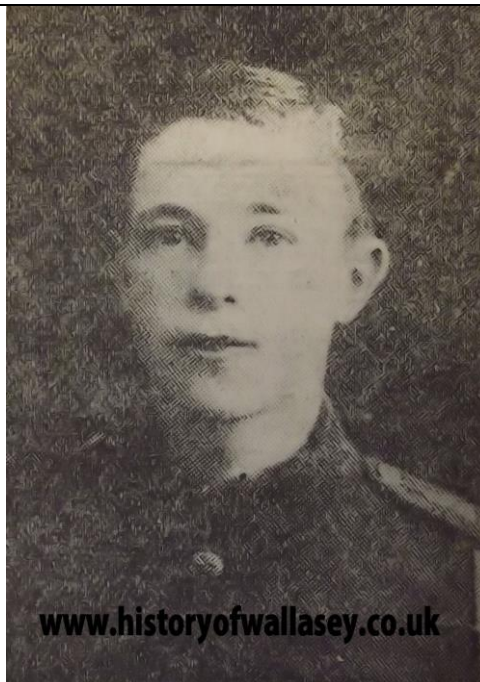

Fatal Wounds In The Head

The sad intelligence has been received of the death from wounds in the head, thigh and hands of Private John Joseph (Joe) Daly, on October 23rd, at a Casualty Clearing Station, France. He joined the Lancashire Fusiliers in October, 1917, and was attached to the Lancashire Hussars. He was transferred to the King's Own Royal Lancasters on being drafted to France last June. Only 19 years of age, he was educated at St. Joseph's School, Wheatland Lane, and was formerly employed as vanman, with the Liscard Laundry. He was the second son of Mr and Mrs M. Daly, and of the late Mr. J. Daly, 3, Shaw Street, Seacombe.
