#### News Report

##### Died From Pneumonia

We regret to record the death of Pte. Joseph Daniels, of pneumonia, which occurred on November 2m at the Auxiliary Military Hospital, Birkenhead. Before the outbreak of the war he was in the "Greys" Volunteers and Territorials, and mobilised with the Cheshire Regt. in January, 1915, and was drafted to France the same year. He came home on leave on October 30<sup>th</sup> for 14 days, but was ill when he arrived, and was taken away to the hospital, Birkenhead, where he passed away. He was a stonemason, and the youngest surviving son of Mr and Mrs J. Daniels, Model Farm, Wallasey. He leaves a widow and two children to mourn his loss, who reside at 39, Guildford Street, Egremont.

The funeral took place last Friday at Rake Lane Cemetery with full military honours. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack and carried on a gun carriage, preceded by a detachment of the South Wales Borders. Three volleys

were fired, and the “Last Post” sounded.
