#### Liscard Grocer Missing (May 1916)

Private William Davies, of the Cheshire Regiment, who was wounded on April 7<sup>th</sup>, is now officially reported as missing. He was educated at St. Mary's School, Liscard, and was employed for over twelve years with Mr. Charles Emery, grocer, late of Liscard Village. He was married in March of last year, and had never seen his baby girl. He is the brother of Mrs. Margaret Dawkes, May Cottage, Wallasey Road, who will be pleased to receive any information.

#### Missing Two Years (March 1918)

Private William Davies, Cheshire Regt., was previously reported in the "Wallasey

News" as wounded and missing. Official intimation has just been received that he was killed in action on April 9, 1916. He went through the Dardanelles, and was afterwards drafted to Egypt and Mesopotamia. He was educated at St. Mary's School, Liscard, and previous to enlistment was in the employ of Mr. Charles Emery, grocer, late of Liscard Village. He leaves a widow and one child, and his sister, Mrs. Margaret Dawkes, resides at 19, Wallasey Road.
