News Report

Poulton Lance-Corporal Killed

Official intimation has been received from the War Office that Lance-Corpl. James (Jim) Dawson, of the Liverpool Scottish (attached to the Cameronians), died from wounds on July 16. He enlisted in May, 1916, and had only been 10 weeks in France. He was educated at Granby Street Schools, Liverpool, and was formerly employed with Mr. Mullin, rubber merchant, Liverpool. He was a teacher in the primary department of Sunday School, Wesleyan (Poulton) Mission, and a drummer in St. Luke's Cadet Corps. Only 19 years of age, he was eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Dawson, 5, Oxton Road, Poulton.
