Somerville Soldier Killed

Intelligence has been received that Sergt. William Nicholas Deakin, of the Cheshire Regt., was killed in action on June 7. He joined the colours at the beginning of the war, and had been 20 months in France. Educated at Somerville Council School, he was an apprenticed fitter with Messrs. J.H. Wilson and Co., Ltd., engineers, Seacombe. He was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. John Deakin, 26. Brentwood Street, Seacombe, and grandson of the late Mr. John Coventry Deakin, Liscard, engineer at the Council Pumping Station.
