<p>News Report</p> <p><u>Killed In Palestine</u></p> <p>News has been received from the War Office that Sergeant Harry Dean, aged 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Dean, of 20, Winterhey Avenue, Seacombe, has been killed in action in Palestine, on 6<sup>th</sup> if November. He was wounded in Gallipoli and was brought to Liverpool in August, 1915, and returned to Egypt, January, 1916. He was educated at the Higher Elementary School, New Brighton, and was very closely connected with the Egremont Baptist Church.</p>
