News Report

Died Of Shrapnel Wounds

Official information has been received that Bombr. Walter Dyson, R.F.A., was wounded by shrapnel in the side and leg on April 26, and died at the Casualty Clearing Station the following day. He joined up at Easter, 1915, and was drafted to France in the same year. He was well-known, having resided in Wallasey nearly all his life. He was the youngest son of Mr Fred Dyson, ironfounder of Leeds, and brother of Mr and Mrs Edward Dyson, 6, Somerville, Wallasey. An officer writes expressing his sympathy, and regretting the death of such a fine soldier.
