Cinema Employee Killed

In a letter from an officer of the Monmouthshire Regiment the sad news of the death of their only son was conveyed to Mr and Mrs Earnshaw, of 83, Urmson Road, Liscard. The letter, which was received on Saturday, stated that Rifleman Stephen Earnshaw was killed in action in the early hours of June 4<sup>th</sup>, and pays tribute to him as a cheerful and good worker. On June 4<sup>th</sup> his mother received a letter from him to say that he was all right, but she little thought that at the very time she was reading that pencilled note with such delight its author was lying somewhere in France a victim of cruel fate.

Rifleman Stephen Earnshaw was 34 years of age, and a joiner by trade, and in the early days of the war was engaged at Ormskirk and Salisbury Plain putting up huts for the troops. He was called to the colours in June of last year, and went out to France in the following November, and was killed in the prime of his

manhood after being a soldier of only twelve months. His father is pensioner of the Liverpool police, and he himself was on the Liverpool tramways for ten years, but was employed at a local picture palace for some time,
