#### News Report

##### Egremont Dentist's Loss

The sad intelligence has been received that Pte. Frederic Ronald Earp, died from wounds on September 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Casualty Clearing Station. Twenty-three years of age, he joined the Cheshire "Pals" at the outbreak of hostilities, and after going into training was transferred to the Royal Welsh Fusiliers, and drafted to France in October, 1915. He was wounded in the foot on May 11, 1916, and after his recovery was sent on garrison duty at Gibraltar. After returning home on leave he went again to France on the 21<sup>st</sup> of June last. He was educated at Councillor Wrigley's High School, Liscard. His favourite hobby was motoring at which he was a keen expert. He was the only son of Mr. F.T. Earp, dentist, and Mrs. Earp, King Street, Egremont.
