"He Did His Duty"

Official information has been received of the death in action of Gunner Walter Eccles, R.F.A., third son of Mrs. C. Eccles, and of the late Mr. James Eccles, of 39, Field Road, New Brighton.

In writing to the bereaved mother the Major of the Barry says that Gunner Eccles was killed instantaneously on October 19th by the bursting of a shell. He did his duty as an Englishman, and could not have wished to die a nobler death. The deceased, who was 23 years of age, had been in France since February of this year. He was educated at Rock School, Magazine Lane, New Brighton, and was a gardener by occupation. Two other brothers are with the colours, Private F. Eccles, of the Cheshire Regt., in France, and Rifleman J.s. Eccles, who is at

present on hospital leave.
