Egremont Lance-Corporal Killed

The sad news has been received that Lance-Corporal Stanley Evans, aged 26 years, of the Royal Engineers, who resided at 43, Exeter Road, Egremont, has died as the result of wounds received while on active service with the British Expeditionary Force. He died on May 9th, the same day that his brother-in-law, Lieutenant [A.E.J. Shackelford](#), of the Seaforth Highlanders was killed in Flanders while leading his men in a brilliant charge.

The late Lance-Corporal Evans leaves a widow and three little children. The late Lance-Corporal Evans was the only son of Mr Sam Evans, chief collector at Seacombe Ferry and a well-known local canine specialist, and Mrs Evans, 27, Belgrave Street, Liscard. He was educated at the Liscard Grammar School, where he had a successful career. On leaving school he adopted the profession of marine engineering, and was apprenticed at the shipbuilding yard of Messrs. H.

Grayson and Co., Ltd. His duties as a marine engineer took him to many parts of the world. He first served with the China Company, and then with the Elder Dempster Line and the Johnstone Line. He took his second engineer's ticket the first time of sitting, being the top man out of fifteen. He joined the Royal Engineers last November, and went to the Dardanelles, after having been to Egypt. He was a member of the Liscard Lodge, No. 2,657, and was initiated by his father in May, 1913. Mr Sam Evans was then Master of the Lodge.
