News Report

Liscard Scottie's Death From Wounds

Official intimation has just been received by Mr. George Fisher, of 83, Martin's Lane, Liscard, of the death from wounds of his son, Lance Corporal Harry Fisher, who took part in the charge at Hooze. Although the information from the War Office only came to hand on Thursday, Lance Corporal Fisher died on the 25th June at Isegham Military Hospital, after having received wounds during the advance at Hooze. The deceased, who was 23 years of age, joined the Liverpool Scottish some three years previous to the outbreak of war, and was drafted to France in October. He returned home in December suffering from rheumatism, and after five weeks leave rejoined his unit at the front, since which time little or nothing had been heard of him until the official announcement of his death.

He has a younger brother serving in the same regiment.
