#### Two Chums Missing

Private Charles Forsyth and Private Fellowes, of the Wallasey Pals, who lived at 9, Scott Street, Liscard, have been missing since the attack of July 7<sup>th</sup>.

Private Charles Forsyth was 21 years of age, and prior to the war was employed by Messrs. Francis Brothers, dairyman, of New Brighton. He is the son of Mr. Forsyth, of Agnes Grove, Liscard

Private William Fellowes was employed at the Tramway Works, Liscard, and was educated at St. Mary's School. He is the eldest son of Mrs. Agnes Fellowes, of 9, Scott Street, Liscard, who has received an official notification from the War Office.

### Reported Killed

Private Charles Forsyth, of the Cheshires, who was reported in the "News" on August 12<sup>th</sup>, 1916, as "missing" has now been officially posted as killed in action.

Previous to joining the colours he was employed with Messrs. Francis Bros., dairyman, New Brighton. He resided at 9. Scott Street, Liscard, and was the son of Mr. Forsyth, Agnes Grove, Egremont.
