News Report

Old Wallaseyan Killed

News has been received that Lance-Corporal Herbert H. Francis, R.A.N.C., has been killed in action at the front. He was the eldest son of the late Mr. W.E. Francis, partner with the late Mr. J.A. Dear, stock and share broker, and enlisted at the outbreak of war. He had served over three years in France. Before joining he was cashier with Mr. James Hughes, stock and share broker, of Queen's Insurance Buildings. He was educated at Wallasey Grammar School and was an enthusiastic footballer of the Old Wallaseyans. His bright and happy disposition always ensured him a host of friends, and at the front he was one of the first to volunteer for any active or dangerous duty.
