News Report

Liscard Organist Killed

The sad intelligence has been received by Mr and Mrs Frith, 4, Manor Lane, Liscard, that their son, R.Q.M.S. Stephen Arthur Frith, of the Labour Corps, was killed in action on April 16. The gallant soldier was educated at the Higher Elementary School, Vaughan Road, and was for five years in the service of the Liverpool United Gas. Co. He was well-known as organist of the Mariners' Home, and St. Thomas' Church, Liscard. When he joined up on March 16 he was organist of St. John's, Birkenhead. Twenty-three years of age, he was a musician of many accomplishments.

2nd Lieut. W.J. Sweetman writes expressing deep sympathy at the loss of R.M.Q.S Frith. A shell burst killing him and others. The chaplain was also killed by the same shell.
