News Report

Wallasey Pal Killed

Information has been received of the death of Private Wilfred J.A. Ha., a signaller of the 13th Cheshires, who is reported to have been killed in action on January 19th in France. Private Hall was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Hall, of 27, Virginia Road, New Brighton, for whom great sympathy will be felt. He was a highly-respected member of New Brighton Wesleyan Church, and a devoted worker at Egerton Street Mission, where he was a special favourite among the children. He only joined the forces in September. In a letter of sympathy to his family Corporal Swift, of the Signal Section of his company, says :- "We all feel his loss very much, as he was a good soldier and comrade, and respected by all who knew him. The signal officer, and myself attended the funeral. He was buried alongside his comrades who fell with him in a little cemetery behind the lines. He is sadly missed by all of us, and we mourn with you in the irreparable loss you have sustained."
