News Report

Missing

Mr. W.H. Haw, of 188, Victoria Road, Seacombe, has received an official notification that his son, Private Henry Haw, has been missing since October 22. No further particulars have yet been received, but Mr. Haw has been informed that the company officer was killed about the same time, so that it may be presumed there was severe fighting in progress.

Private Haw, who was 32 years of age, joined up in May last year, and went to France last January. He was well known in the district, and was in business as a watchmaker. For five years prior to enlisting he carried on an establishment of his own in Seabank Road, and had previously worked for Mr. Knagg, of Rake Lane, Liscard.

Missing Soldier Reported Killed

(August 1918)

Mr and Mrs W.H. Haw. Of 188, Borough Road, Seacombe, have received official

information that their youngest son, Pte. Henry Haw, of the Cheshire Regt., who was reported missing on Oct. 22, 1917, was killed in action. Pte. Haw, who was 32 years of age, joined up in May, 1916, and went to France the following January. Prior to enlisting he was in business as a jeweller in Seabank Road, New Brighton.
