##### Bank Clerk Killed

To official sad intimation has been received that Lieut. Leo John Hayes was killed in action on October 10<sup>th</sup>. He joined the Army Service Corps in August, 1915, and had been two years in France, when he came home for his commission, and became attached to the King's Liverpool Regiment, and was drafted to Salonika. He was formerly in the service of the Bank of Liverpool at the Wrexham branch. He leaves a widow and two children, who reside at 20, Manville Road, New Brighton.
