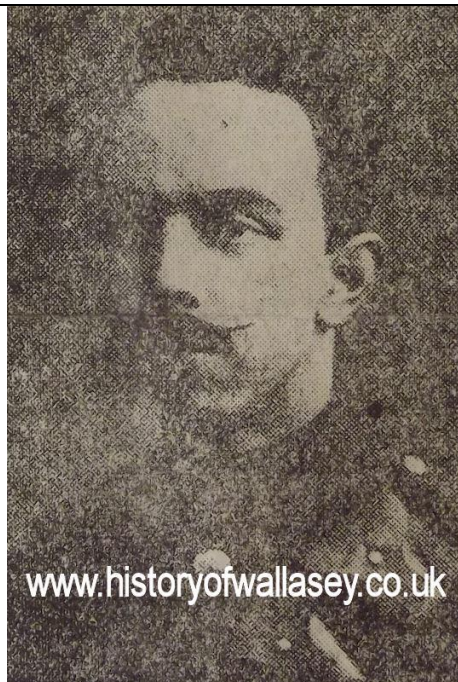

News Report

Artillery Gunner Killed

Official news has been received of the death of Gunner Alfred Kinds, Royal Field Artillery, who was killed in action on October 20. He joined the Army in July of last year and had been some none months in France. He was the youngest son of Mr. Kinds, of Liverpool, and his wife with two children reside at 82, Norwood Road, Poulton.

The Rev. Claude B. Prior, C.F., writes:- "Your husband, Gunner Alfred Hinds, who was killed in action on the 20th of this month, was a man of exemplary character and much respected. His body is buried in a British Military Cemetery and the battery intend to erect a special cross over his grave."

His brother, Harry Hinds, who is also serving in France, has sent a letter to Mrs. Hinds in which he says, "I have received a most touching message from the

major, and the Captain spoke very feelingly and touchingly respecting dear Alf. He was very popular with the battery and consequently made many friends.”
