#### Information Wanted

(January 1919)

Mr and Mrs Cuthbert Hughes, of 20 Lindeth Avenue, Wallasey, will be very grateful if any repatriated prisoner, who fought at the Battle of Hooge, can give them any information concerning their son, Pte. William (Willie) Robert Hughes, 1-10<sup>th</sup> Liverpool Scottish, who is missing. No news if him has come to hand. He is in his 23<sup>rd</sup> year, and was an old Territorial, mobilising at the outbreak of the war. He was drafted to France in November, 1914. He was an old St. Mary's School boy, and was formerly in the employ of Messrs. David Dargie and Co., engineers, Strand Street, Liverpool. He was a member of the Wallasey Harriers, and attended Seacombe Presbyterian Church.

His elder brother, Pte. [Thomas M.S. Hughes](#), of the Liverpool Scottish, was killed in action on April 6, 1915.
