#### News Report

##### The Deadly Sniper

Mrs. W. Humphreys, of 38, Palatine Road, has been officially notified that her husband, Private W. Humphreys, of the 4<sup>th</sup> Cheshires, was killed in action on August 23<sup>rd</sup>.

She had not heard from her husband since August 18<sup>th</sup>, and though naturally anxious, was hoping to hear from him soon.

Through private sources, she has heard that her husband was shot by a sniper, while getting water from a well.

Private Humphreys first joined the "Greys" six years ago, and patriotically rejoined on the outbreak of war.

He proceeded to the Dardanelles with his regiment in July and took part in the difficult operations from then till the time of his death.
