##### A Soldier And A Gentleman

Local football and golf enthusiasts will deeply regret to hear that Lance-Corporal T.H. Hunt (Liverpool "Pals"), of Wallasey Village, has been officially reported as missing, and it is greatly feared that he has lost his life. A capital golfer, he was also for many years a local goalkeeper of repute, his best services in that respect being rendered to the old Wallasey Village Club. He was formerly a regular football correspondent to the columns of the Chronicle, and was a winner of one of our "pithy pars" gold medals. He was amongst the first to enlist in the Liverpool City Battalions and was well known and very popular in Liverpool cotton circles.

A letter received yesterday (Friday) by Mrs Halliday, Tom Hunt's grandmother, whom he resided at 91, Wallasey Village, unhappily leaves no doubt as to his sad fate. The communication was from Lieutenant Heap, who stated that the deceased was instantaneously killed by machine gun fire on July 10<sup>th</sup>. The officer paid a high tribute to the sterling qualities of the deceased soldier, whom he

described as a soldier and a gentleman. Lance-Corporal Hunt was in his 31<sup>st</sup> year.
