#### News Report

##### Died From Wounds

The sad intelligence has been received of the death of Private Albert Egbert Jefferies, aged 26, of Kings Liverpool Regiment. A telegram from the War Office says :- "Regret to report A.E.. Jefferies died of wounds at the Casualty Station in France on November 24<sup>th</sup>." He joined the Army fourteen months ago, and had only been in France about two months. The brave boy finished his education at Liscard High School, and was employed as clerk in the National Health section of the Royal Liverpool Friendly Society. – He attended the Baptist Church, [Seabank Road](#), and was a member of the Young Men's Class. He is the first boy from the church who has laid down his life for his country. He is the only son of Mr. and Mrs. A.E. Jefferies, of 19, Dalmorton Road, New Brighton, who are well known in the religious life of Wallasey. Much sympathy has been expressed for them in their sad bereavement.
