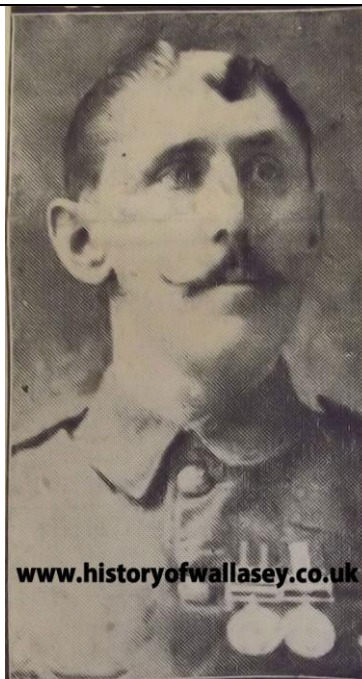

News Report

Death of Sergeant P. Jones

The death of Sergeant P. Jones, of 32, New Street, Seacombe at Cambridge Hospital, Aldershot, last Thursday, came as a severe shock to a host of Wallasey and Liverpool friends, to whom he had endeared himself by his sterling manly disposition and patriotic zeal. Hardly had the war broken out before the appeal to duty dominated the most cherished domestic ties. Former long service in the King's Own Scottish Borderers with which regiment he served through the Boer campaign, made the national appeal irresistible and willingly making a sacrifice of a good position held in Seacombe he joined the King's Liverpool Regiment, 13th Battalion, received immediate promotion to his former rank as sergeant, and at once undertook the arduous duties of drill instructor at Seaforth. Here he earned the highest commendation of his chief and the warm affection of "the boys." On the transfer of his Battalion to Aldershot, he continued this work, and again at Farnham until a week ago, when he was selected for special service at

Hayling Island. He was joyfully anticipating a few days leave among his old friends before taking up his new post, when he was struck down by pneumonia and passed away on Thursday last. The whole of his sorrowing company paraded at the military funeral, as well as many of his former comrades in the King's Own Scottish Borderers.
