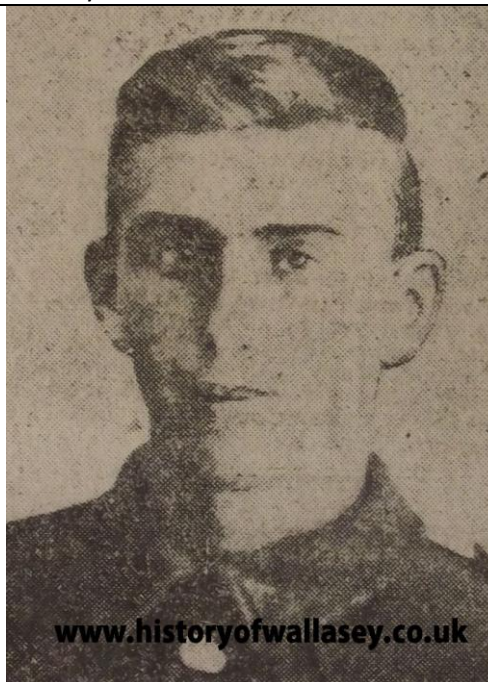

News Report

Missing Poulton Soldier [August 1916]

Private R.L. (Leo.) Kent, of the 11<sup>th</sup> Cheshires, the second son of Mr. and Mrs. R.L. Kent, of 11, Chamberlain Street, Poulton, is officially returned as "Missing since July 3<sup>rd</sup>." He was educated at the Poulton Schools and was employed at the Anglo-American Oil Company, Birkenhead. He attended St. Luke's Church. An elder brother, Private Edward Kent, was killed at the Dardanelles twelve months ago.

Second Son Killed [June 1917]

Pte. R.L. (Leo) Kent, of the Cheshire Regt., the second son of Mr. and Mrs. R.L. Kent, of 11 Chamberlain Street, Poulton, who was officially reported missing on

July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1916, is now reported deceased was educated at the Poulton Schools, and was employed by the Anglo-American Oil. Co. He was also a member of St. Luke's Church. An elder brother Pte. Edward Kent, also of the Cheshire Regt., was killed in Gallipoli in August, 1915.
