A Patriotic Family

One Killed And Three Killed

Mr and Mrs H.R. Kenyon, of 9, Magazine Lane, New Brighton, have lost one son at the front, and three others have been injured.

Corporal William Kenyon, of the Australian Imperial Forces, was 28 years of age, and was killed in action on July $29^{\rm th}$. HE was educated at the Liverpool Institute and had been in Australia for eight years.

Private Henry F. Kenyon, of the Liverpool Regiment, 32 years of age, is in hospital at Leatherhead, suffering from a fractured ankle.

Chief Petty George G. Kenyon, who is in the Navy, was severely burnt by an

explosion.

Private John (Jack) D. Kenyon, aged 24, of the Australian Forces, was severely wounded in the head and is in the Colchester Military Hospital making slow progress.
