#### News Report

##### Died From Wounds

We regret to state that Sergeant George T. Lee, of the Wallasey Pals, the son of Mr and Mrs Thomas Lee, of 89, Bell Road, Seacombe, who was wounded in the recent advance, has succumbed to the injuries.

Official intimation was received by the parents on Wednesday morning that the wounds had proved fatal. He was wounded on July 7<sup>th</sup> and died the following day/ Sergeant Lee, who was 21 years of age, was employed at Messrs Buchanan's flour mills, Seacombe, and played in the firm's football and cricket clubs. He was also a member of the City Angling Association. He enlisted a fortnight after the outbreak of war. Acting-Sergeant-Major R. McLachlan, in a letter to the parents, says:- "He is sadly missed by the N.C.O.'s., and men of his company and also myself, for h was one of the best N.C.O.'s I had. He was always cheerful and attentive to his duties. His place will be hard to fill."
