One Son Killed

The sad news has been received that Pte. Harold Lee, of the Lancashire Fusiliers (formerly Lance-Corporal, K.L.R.) was killed in action on April 21. He was educated at Riverside Council School, where he gained distinction as an athlete. An old Territorial with the King's Liverpool Regiment at the outbreak of the war, he served with the B.E.F. up to May, 1916, when he was "time expired." He was called up again in August, 1916, and enrolled in the Lancashire Fusiliers. He trained at Colchester in February last, and was then transferred to a light truck mortar. He was the third son of Mr. and Mrs Edmund Charles Lee, 68, Deveraux Drive, Wallasey, and the husband of Grace A. Lee, 475, Borough Road, Birkenhead.

Private John. C. Lee (eldest son), of the Cheshire Regiment, is now in India.

Gunner Edmund T. Lee (second son), of the Royal Garrison Artillery, in with the Siege Battery, Italian Army.

Lance-Corporal Percy Lee (fourth son), of the King's Liverpool Regiment, invalided home from France after 21 months service, is now attached to the Hampshire Regiment, Colchester.

Private Lionel Lee (youngest son) joined the King's Liverpool Regiment, and was rejected.
